

Voter Identification in the Polls

Identification Requirement

- Michigan Driver's license or personal identification card
- Driver's license or personal identification card issued by another state
- Federal or state government issued photo identification
- US Passport
- Military Identification Card with photo
- Student identification with photo
- Tribal Identification card with photo

The Michigan Supreme Court ruled on July 18, 2007 that a provision of Michigan election law which requires voters to either present picture identification or sign an affidavit if they do not have picture identification with them is constitutional and enforceable.

Please note if a voter is well known to the election inspector handling the picture identification requirement they still must present a photo ID; and if they cannot present a photo ID they must sign an affidavit stating they are not in possession of a picture ID.

The picture identification requirement does not impact the absentee voting process in any way.

If a voter refuses to present a picture ID or refuses to sign an affidavit form they will not be allowed to vote.
